GET A UK SIM CARD

For information -please check details yourself and decide what is best for you

You are likely to need a UK mobile phone number for lots of things (Getting a bank account, registering for benefits or work) so this may be one of the first things you may want to do.

- Some Ukrainian visitors are being given one at the Airport or port of entry advivce is to go to the Ukrainian help desk at the airport or port and you will receive information free parking at some airports, and a sim card
- British Red Cross have some Vodaphone SIM cards to give out and you or your host (they can request before your arrival) can ask for one – so contact the red cross on 0344 871 1111 and select option 5 – if they have any in stock they will send one to you

Refugeese have an online application <u>Apply for a Vodafone SIM for Ukrainian</u> <u>refugees — RefugEase</u> where the guest can apply or the host once there is a confirmed arrival date

Voda phone Sims have 20GB of Free Data per month and Free international Calls and Texts (all for 6 months)

Whitsable welcome network WWN are trying to get a local supply but don't have any at the moment

• Three (3) network are giving free SIM Cards to Ukrainian's with 30 day credit for unlimited calls and texts, as well as unlimited data for use within the UK.

Free texts and call from UK to Ukraine is part of current 3 network support

- Pay as you Go Sim Cards are available on different networks and at many different places. The best del depends on what you want to use if for. Some networks are offering free calls and texts to Ukraine but not clear if and when that will change
- Moving to a different network If you don't have a contract (PAYG) it is normally quite easy to transfer your UK mobile phone number. Consider getting a sim card which will be used for the first few weeks while you find out what might suit you better longer term April 2022
